

TB REACH Wave 7

Eligible Countries

Applicants intending to work in any of the following countries are eligible to apply for TB REACH funding. Please note the eligibility criteria apply to the country you intend to work in, which may not be the same as the country your organization is situated in.

Eligible countries with no restriction:

Low-income and lower-middle income economies¹

Additional countries with incidence rates above 100 people with TB per 100,00 population² and countries included in WHO's high TB, TB/HIV, and/or MDR-TB burden countries lists²

[‡]Applicants intending to work in any of the countries below must provide a justification in their proposal that activities will target: Areas with low TB case detection or poor treatment outcomes, poor populations (poverty pockets), and/or people with limited access to existing TB care services.

Eligible Organizations

A variety of organizations are eligible to apply for TB REACH funding, including but not limited to:

- National TB programmes (NTP)
- province, state or district TB programmes
- Other government agencies/ministries
- International or national or local universities / research institutes
- International or national or local NGO or community-based organizations
- UN or other international agencies

For-profit companies may be part of an application consortium, but cannot receive funding directly from TB REACH.
