World TB Day 2008 - planning materials now available

The Stop TB Partnership Secretariat has created an e-toolkit to help countries plan World TB Day (WTBD) activities. The e-toolkit includes a short guide on planning a WTBD event - explaining this year's theme and the key global messages. The document also gives advice on how to plan and organize ACSM activities to mark World TB Day in your community/region/country. There is information on developing locally tailored key messages, planning media events, and mobilizing partners for action.

Advocacy, communication and social mobilization for TB control: a handbook for country programmes



The ACSM Handbook is a guide to support the design and implementation of ACSM activities and is primarily intended for staff that plan, organize and supervise TB control activities at the national level. Because tackling TB requires commitment and work at all levels, this guide can also be used by TB control staff at the provincial, state, and regional levels; by nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) and others involved in TB control.

Future products include "companion pieces" to the ACSM Handbook. Companion pieces will be easy, how-to guides for the implementation of ACSM at country level. The first in the series will be on the vital topic of social mobilization.

The Guide to Knowledge, Attitude and Practice (KAP) Surveys has been developed to help systematize countries' approaches to collecting and using data from KAP surveys for planning, refining and evaluating ACSM work. This guide is intended to serve as a practical toolkit that offers a theoretical framework, practical suggestions, and a menu of useful resources and tools.

Practical guidance is provided in 6 easy-to-understand steps: defining survey objectives, developing survey protocol, designing survey questionnaire, implementing KAP survey, analyzing data and using the data.
