Moldova launches TB awareness raising campaign with Stop TB Ambassador



Speranta Terrei, an NGO in Moldova is working with national authorities in launching a TB-awareness campaign in the northern city of Balti. The campaign is built around the image and messages of Stop TB Partnership Ambassador Luis Figo and includes the launch of the comic book <u>Luis Figo and the World Tuberculosis Cup</u>.

At the launch event on 9 October, volunteers from Balti Medical College, who have formed a theatre troop for the campaign, re-enacted the battle between Figo's team of teens

and the team of TB germs that takes place in the comic book Luis Figo and the World Tuberculosis Cup. A <u>public service announcement</u> on TB, featuring Figo, was also screened for the audience in its Russian-language version.

The theatre troop will start visiting schools in November, acting out TB messages and handing out the comic books, as well as other TB-related materials from Moldova's national TB public awareness campaigns. The intervention will also have a monitoring component to assess impact in level of awareness raised.

ACSM in Action

District-level ACSM training and planning workshop in India

PATH, with financial support from USAID and in collaboration with the State TB Control Society, organized a 4-day action planning workshop on advocacy, communication and social mobilization in Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh, India. Participants of the this district-level planning workshop included District TB Control Officers, Medical TB Officers and Senior Treatment Supervisors, as well as communication facilitators and local NGO partners and WHO consultants.



The methodologies used by the facilitators walked the participants through a systematic process of programme gap identification and analysis. Participants used this analysis to develop concrete ACSM action plans for their respective TB Units, using a standardized ACSM planning form. Plans for scaling up District-level training is currently underway for other Districts in India.



Technology allows patients to exchange views and experiences across borders

In September, 14 tuberculosis patients in Japan and the Philippines used videoconferencing to exchange views on their TB experiences, including the emotional impact of being diagnosed with TB and revealing their diagnosis to family, friends and the community. The patients also discussed stigma, adherence to DOTS, and the expenses arising from their TB treatment. Finally, the patients in both countries expressed gratitude to the people who had supported them and provided them with access to quality TB services, and vowed to support other TB patients.



The event—organized the <u>Stop TB Partnership Japan</u> in collaboration with the <u>Japan Anti-Tuberculosis Association</u>, the <u>World Bank Tokyo Office</u>, the <u>JICA Philippine Office</u> and RESULTS Japan and sponsored by the <u>International Communications Foundation</u>, <u>Japan</u>—was observed by physicians, the Japanese media, pharmaceutical company representatives, Japan Anti-Tuberculosis Association/Research Institute of Tuberculosis officials, and the general public.
