Submission of abstracts for poster or oral presentations of research on all aspects of tuberculosis control (including epidemiologic, clinical, basic science, social, behavioral, psychosocial and educational studies) are welcome for presentation at the 10th Annual Conference of the International Union Against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease-North America Region, March 2-4, 2006.

Information for Authors

- The first author is responsible for the abstract content
- Submission affirms that the material has not previously been published
- Resubmission of abstract is not permitted
- At least one author must attend the Meeting

Oral and Poster Presentations

- Three or four abstracts will be selected for oral presentation at the Meeting, unless poster presentation only is requested
- Additional abstracts will be selected for poster presentation

Abstract Form

- Complete the abstract form for submission with the abstract
- Provide a complete mailing address including the country and zip code, phone number and Email address
- Indicate whether you wish the abstract considered for poster presentation only, or for either poster or oral presentation
- Abstract form may also be obtained from The American Lung Association of Metropolitan Chicago (www.lungchicago.org/Education/IUATLD)

Abstract Content

- All abstracts must be in **English**
- Abstracts must be typed and no more than 250 words
- Avoid smudges, errors and misspellings
- The heading should include the title of the presentation (in CAPITAL LETTERS), the family names and initials of all authors, institutions, city, country (omit degrees, street address and zip code)
- Underline the name of the author who will attend the Meeting to present the poster or make the oral presentation
- The body of the abstract should contain the following sections (SECTION NAMES IN CAPITAL LETTERS)
 - TITLE
 - BACKGROUND (brief)
 - METHODS
 - RESULTS (present both numbers and proportions)
 - CONCLUSION

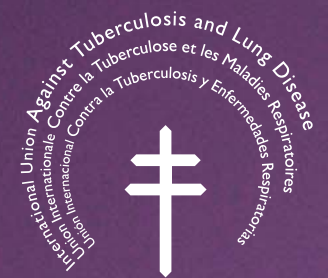
Notification

NAR/ITF Travel Grant Award:

Each year depending on the amount of funding received from Friendship Fund through the International Tuberculosis Foundation, Pittsfield Anti-Tuberculosis Association, and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, we provide some travel assistance to deserving participants who submitted their abstracts for presentation at the meeting. 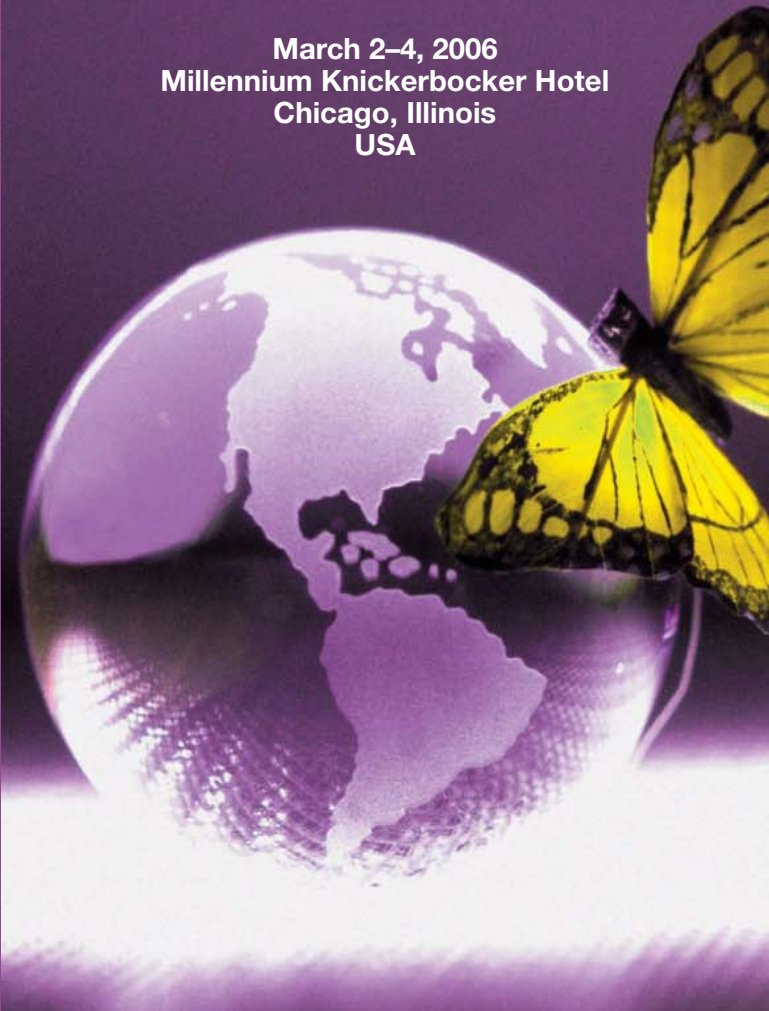
