Description of Round 6 ACSM Activities

Objectives: The goal would be achieved through five project objectives. Namely to:

1. assure a regular uninterrupted supply of quality anti-TB drugs to all TB patients;
2. increase access to quality smear microscopy for TB diagnosing so as to attain 70% case detection;
3. expand and strengthen TB/HIV collaborative activities country wide;
4. strengthen community mobilization for TB control; and
5. strengthen program capacity for management, monitoring & evaluation.

Objective 4: To strengthen community mobilization for TB control

SDA 1: Advocacy, communication and social mobilization

4.1.1 Hold 1-day advocacy meetings with District leaders

District Political leadership regularly changes with elections. It will therefore be necessary to bring newly elected ones on board to plan for and sustain CBDOTS in their respective districts. In line with this it is proposed to hold a one-day workshop on CBDOTS (for 30 districts in quarter two, 30 in three and 19 in fourth quarter) to enlighten district leaders on CBDOTS, the roles of each player and to enlist their support. On average 30 district officials (both political and civil) per district will participate. ZTLS and DTLS will be the chief facilitators. However in districts

where there are NGOs they will be charged with the responsibility to implement. Cost implications include per diem and transport refund for participants, ZTLS and driver, hall hire, stationery and facilitation fee.

The output here would be 2,370 district officials sensitized

4.1.2 Operationalize comprehensive TB and TB/HIV communication strategy

4.1.2.1 Print and disseminate health education messages (News paper messages, production of magazines(USTOPTB), pamphlets and posters, translation into different languages

It is proposed to use the health education section of the MOH to develop & produce pamphlets, newspaper messages on TB and TB/HIV. Districts would then translate these into local languages thus adapt them into local settings.

4.1.2.2 Produce posters in different languages

It is proposed to use CSOs and private sector to produce 5,000 educational posters on TB and on TB/HIV in 6 main languages in the country per year.

4.1.2.3 Produce TB Magazines

The STOP TB partner ship will produce a magazine on TB and TB/HIV each year with contribution of articles from the stake holders.

4.1.2.4 and 5 Run radio messages on TB at National and District levels

Radios are playing an increasingly important role in educating and mobilizing communities. Those running at the moment are funded in part by the current GFATM grant. It is proposed to continue and expand this to involve more local FM radio stations at district level. TB health education messages will therefore be made and aired in the form of jingles in the 6 main languages in the country. Each quarter 2 two jingles per language per day for one month will be aired. Implementation will be divided between Central level, districts and partners (CSOs).

4.1.2.6 Drama shows on TB

It is proposed to use GF R 6 to support local drama groups per district to produce plays on TB. Each group will perform 4 shows per year.

4.1.2.7 Community video shows/films

GF R2 supported the production of videos on TB. It is proposed to R6 to dub these and to show videos on TB once quarter per HSD.

4.1.2.8 Sensitize communities

Sensitization meetings will be conducted at the sub county level by the Sub-County health Workers. Each sub-county will have at least one meeting a year giving a total of 2000 meetings over 2 years.

4.1.2.9 School health activities on TB and TB/HIV

School talks will be conducted by Health Educators and school teachers and civil society organizations previously trained as trainers of trainers in round 2 of the Global fund. School talks will be conducted in 300 schools per district over a 2 year period.

4.1.3 Commemorate World TB Day

It is planned to use project funds to support both the National World TB Day commemoration at National as well as district levels. At national venue cost implication usually include: media coverage, support activities a week prior to the day, support drama groups, erection of pavilion, transport and entertainments

The event will also be used to reward the best performing district and that with the best improved indicators.
