# **ABOUT THE PROJECT**

**PROBLEM STATEMENT** — Not all DR-TB high burden province(s) have established TB patient organizations because POP TB lacks knowledge and capabilities to tap local financing to expand their activities. Lack of advocacy work led by TB affected communities, that were initially established only as peer supporters, for timely and improved quality person centered TB care and prevention for key populations, requires multi sector support. However, achieving this requires organizational and individual capacity building as well as networking. Addressing this also means overcoming stigma and discrimination after receiving a DR-TB diagnosis to resolve ambivalence in starting and/or continuing treatment.

**AIM** — Achieve TB elimination by 2030 through empowerment and meaningful participation of TB affected communities, including POP TB.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- 1 To increase community and civil society leadership and participation in the TB response fro m prioritizing and designing interventions to implement, monitor, and evaluate TB services.
- 2 Strengthen advocacy for TB affected communities at the national and sub national levels with focus on key stakeholders and decision makers.

**CONTRIBUTION TO REACHING KEY <u>UN HLM TARGETS</u> BY 2022.** Through ACE-TB, Stop TB Partnership Indonesia and POP TB Indonesia aims to promote and support efforts to end stigma and discrimination (structural/social barriers) towards people affected by Tuberculosis. Hence, we are working to transform our TB response to be people-centered, community-based, gender-responsive and based on human rights by 2022.
