ABOUT THE PROJECT

PROBLEM STATEMENT

- Enhance the EECA region civil society and TB community's coordination and capacity to strategically contribute to national and regional UN HLM on TB accountability efforts reaching 2022 UN HLM targets.
- Addressing the regional and national operational dimensions of the meaningful involvement of affected communities and civil society in TB response and ensure the learning channel between neighboring countries to share evidence on effective approaches of community advocacy for sustainable TB financing and rights-based, gender-equitable and people-centered TB services.

AIM — To strengthen the role of civil society and the affected TB community in advocacy and programmatic activities, in order to transform the TB response to one which promotes and protects human rights, gender equality and people-centeredness and which accelerates accountability processes in the Eastern Europe and Central Asia Region.

OBJECTIVES

- 1 To strengthen the organizational, advocacy, CRG and TB technical capacity of TB affected communities and civil society in high burden TB countries in the Europe region to achieve by 2022 specific targets set by UN Political Declaration on TB for UN Member States.
- 2 To align and boost country community advocacy efforts at regional level needed for the implementation of a rights-based, gender sensitive and people-centered response to TB with a focus on key and vulnerable populations and the meaningful engagement of affected communities / and civil society in all aspects of TB response, including accountability.
- 3 To continue to facilitate knowledge, evidence and lessons sharing for TB civil society, communities and key affected particularly on the aspects of sustainable domestic financing for civil society and community-based services; populations to effectively engage with TB decision-makers, particularly on the aspects of sustainable domestic financing for civil society and community-based services.
- 4 To facilitate coordinated engagement of networks of civil society, TB survivors and other affected communities (HIV, Viral hepatitis, patients' rights, sexual and ethnic minorities) to jointly contribute to the regional and national policies and implementation of action plans for health system strengthening, multisectoral and integrated response across three diseases of (TB/HIV & Viral hepatitis).

STRATEGIC ALIGNMENTS



CONTRIBUTION TO REACHING KEY UN HLM TARGETS BY 2022. Through CFCS, TBEC's advocacy will support the development of integrated, people-centred, community-based and gender-responsive health services in the region based on human rights for vulnerable and key populations. TBEC will ensure the timely implementation of the Multisectoral Accountability Framework, enhancing accountability to reach the UN HLM targets and commitments.



ALIGNMENT WITH NATIONAL PRIORITIES AND THE TB STRATEGIC PLAN. Working with countries at a regional level TBEC works supports countries to adjust and transform respective NSPs to include CRG and principles of multisectoral accountability.

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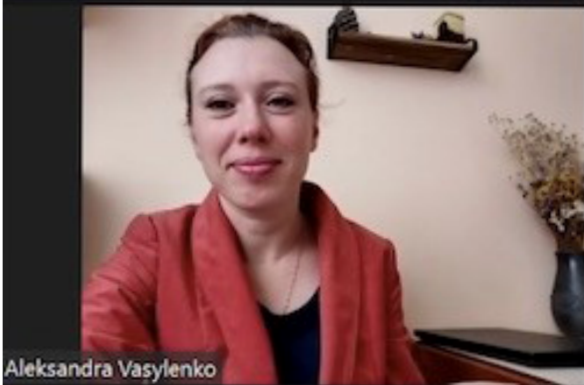
