Purpose of the meeting

The annual meeting of the Stop TB Child and Adolescent TB working group (hereafter referred to as the working group) will be organized on Monday 11 November 2024 in Bali, Indonesia.

The meeting will be open to all members of the working group and other interested stakeholders, representing a broad range of stakeholders including paediatricians, national TB programme (NTP) focal points for TB in children and adolescents, maternal and child health (MCH) representatives, technical and financial partners, community TB representatives, TB survivors and World Health Organization (WHO) staff from headquarters, regional and country offices.

The main purpose of the annual meeting is to share new developments and country experiences in scaling up the response to child and adolescent TB and to discuss next steps to move the agenda forward.

More specifically, the objectives are to:

- To evaluate implementation of the key actions included in the Roadmap towards ending TB in children and adolescents third edition, one year after the launch;
- To provide an update on data on TB in children and adolescents based on the Global Tuberculosis Report 2024;
- To provide an update on activities of the working group since the meeting on 14 November 2023 in Paris, France;
- To share recent resources on TB in children and adolescents;
- To share experiences with the uptake of recent WHO policy recommendations as well as innovations;
- To discuss proposed research principles and priorities related to TB in children and adolescents; and,
- To share selected recent papers on TB in children and adolescents.
